New single ‘Echoes of a Dying World’ is a track that fully encapsulates that ethos, defying societal pressures to conform and chase other people’s superficial ideas of perfection. The band continue to channel influences from post-grunge, metalcore and the alternative sphere on the new to craft a sound that feels as hard-hitting as it is defiant, embodying a powerful feeling of nihilism and frustration with a world in decline.

Universal feelings such as longing for emotional connection and battling with internal struggles and social isolation offer a vulnerability and honesty that will only strengthen their bond with listeners, reflecting on the human condition and offering a sense of belonging and kinship to anybody who feels lost in a world that feels increasingly unkind and unforgiving.

Says frontman Jason Payne: “‘Echoes of a Dying World’ is a sonic journey through destruction and rebirth, reflecting themes of loss, resilience, and the struggle for identity. It’s a song that demands to be felt as much as it is heard.”

The band’s message feels as pronounced and as vital as ever on the new single, and its deeply personal and honest nature sets it apart in a sea of talented and engrossing modern metal bands who are populating an increasingly healthy scene right now.
